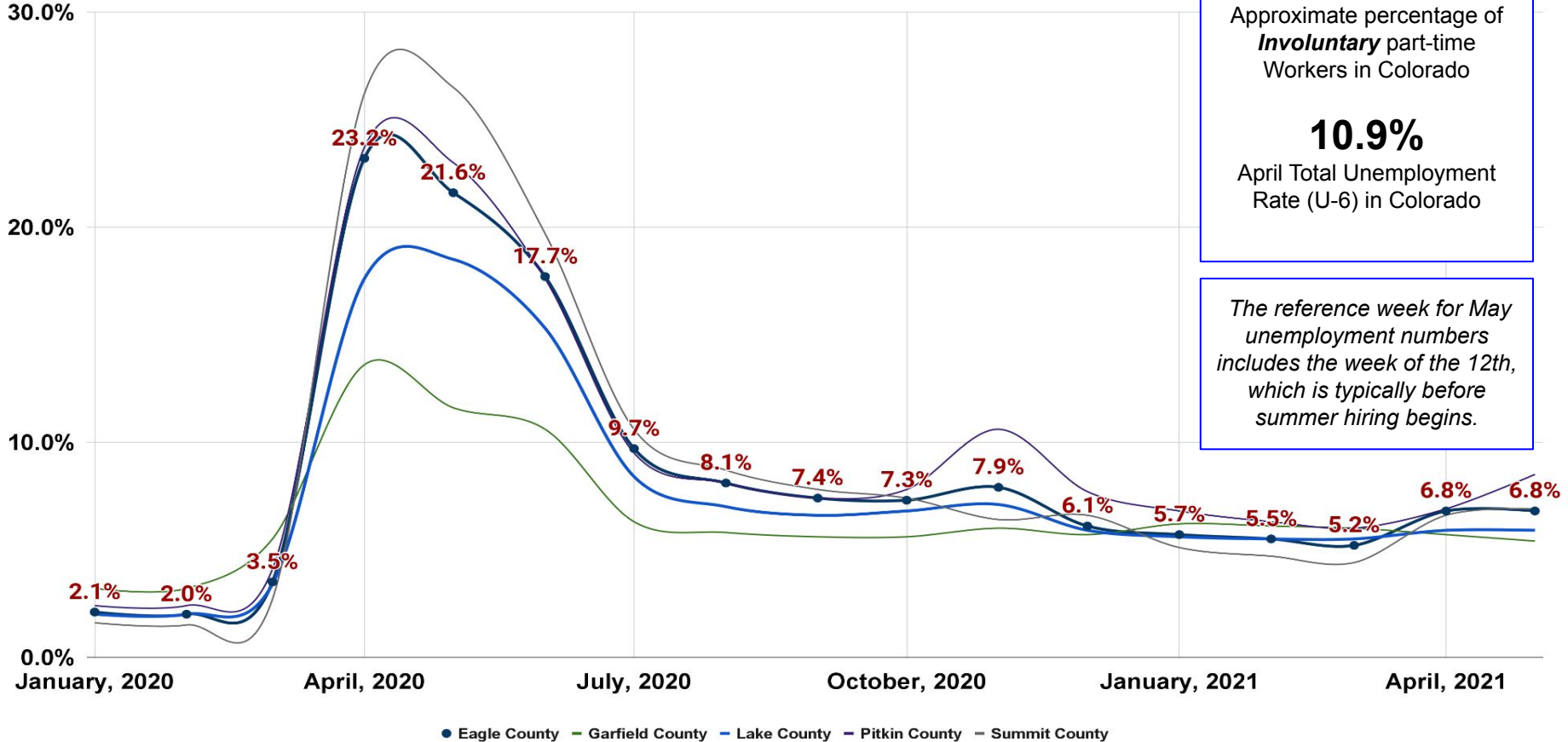

Through May, 2021

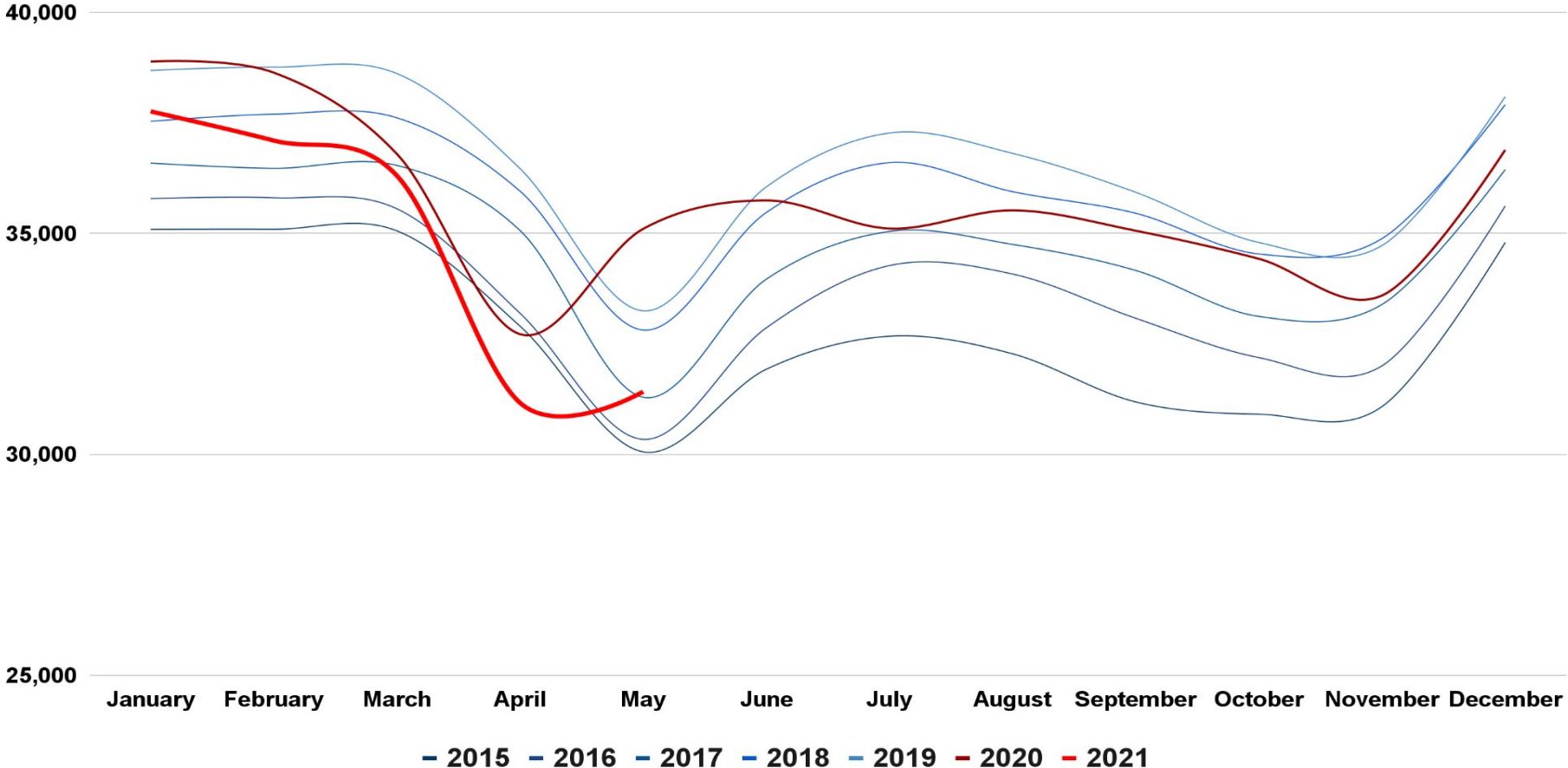

Eagle County Total Labor Force

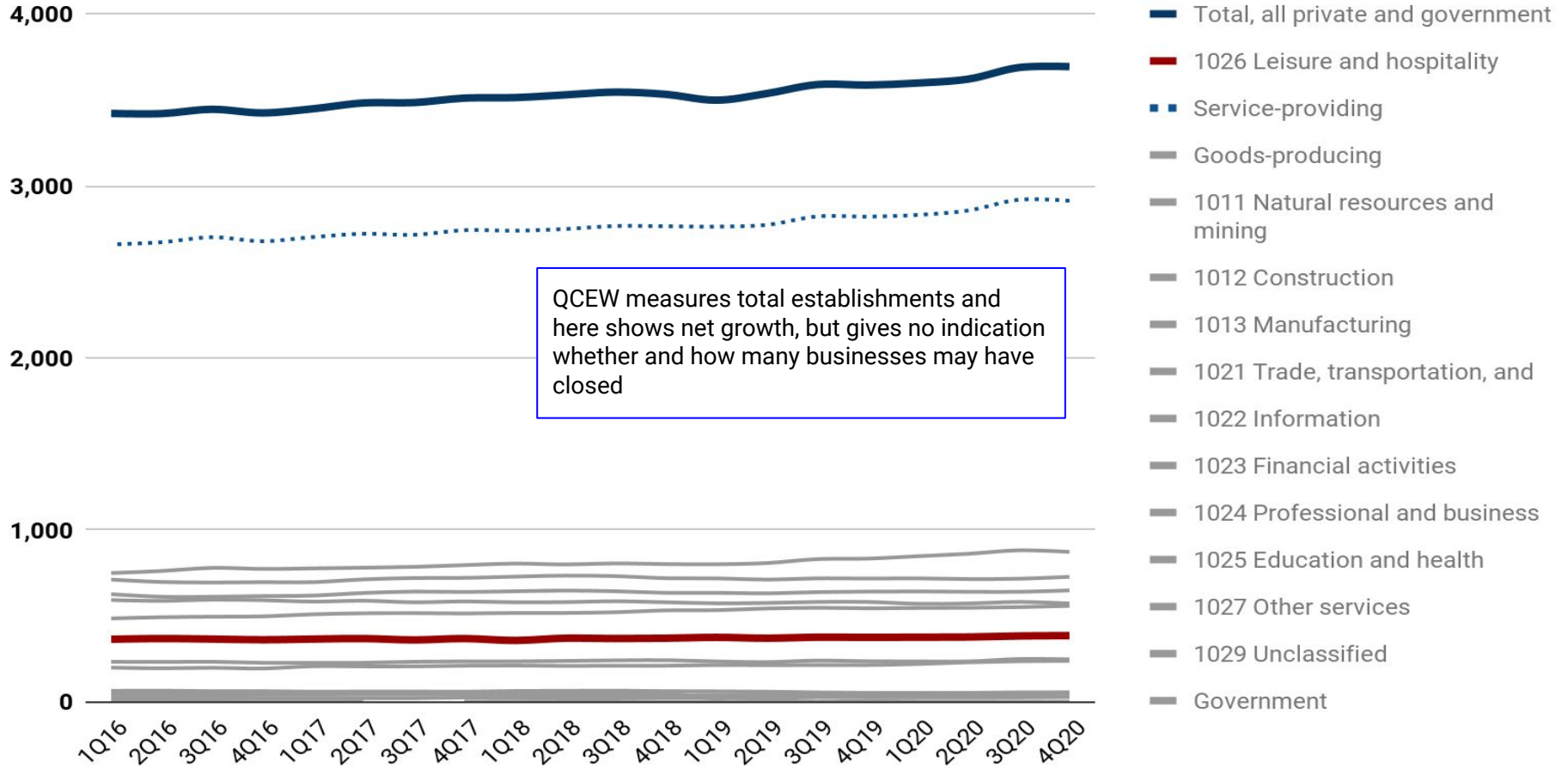

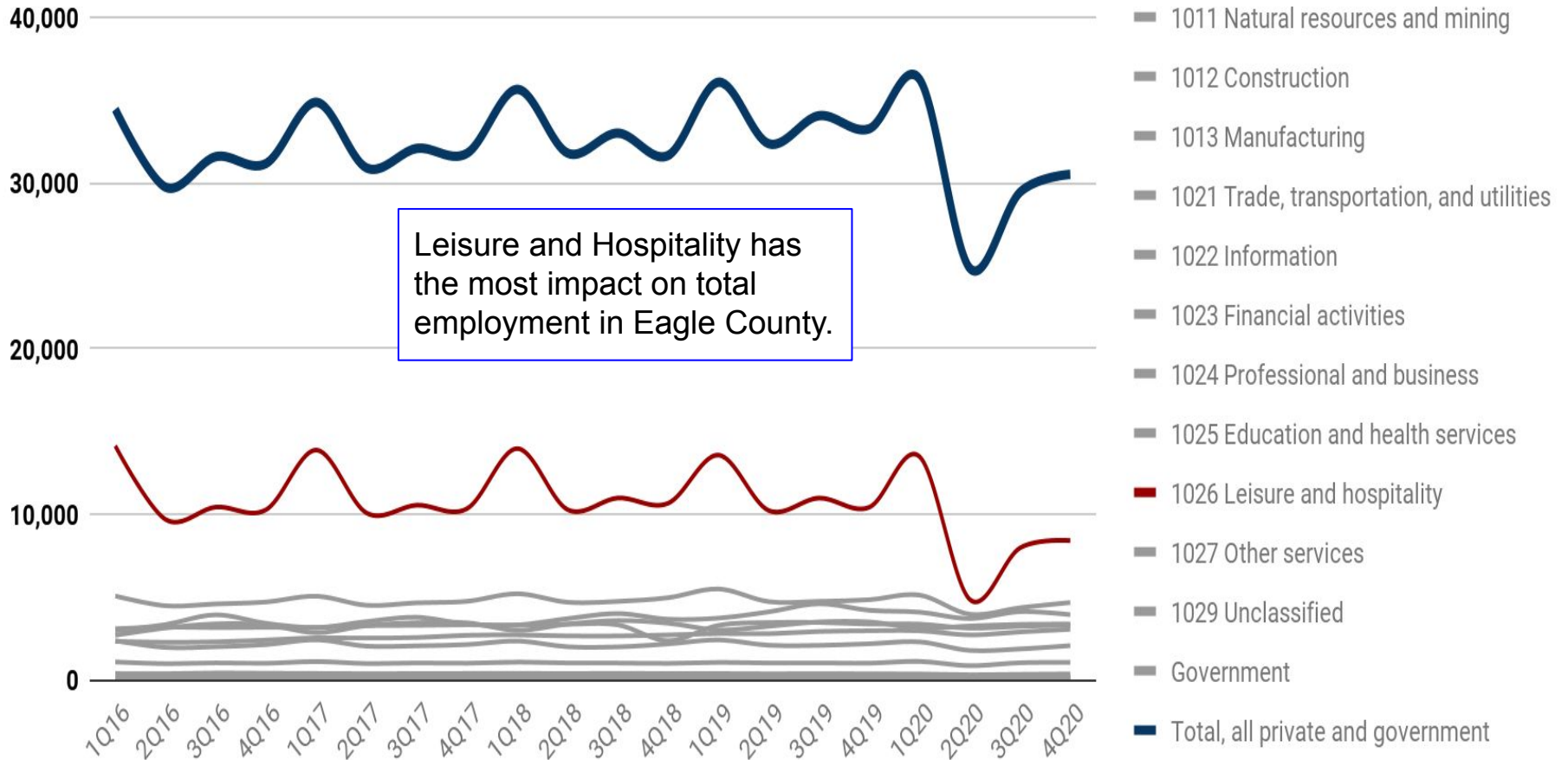
Labor Force Participation Rate Trends



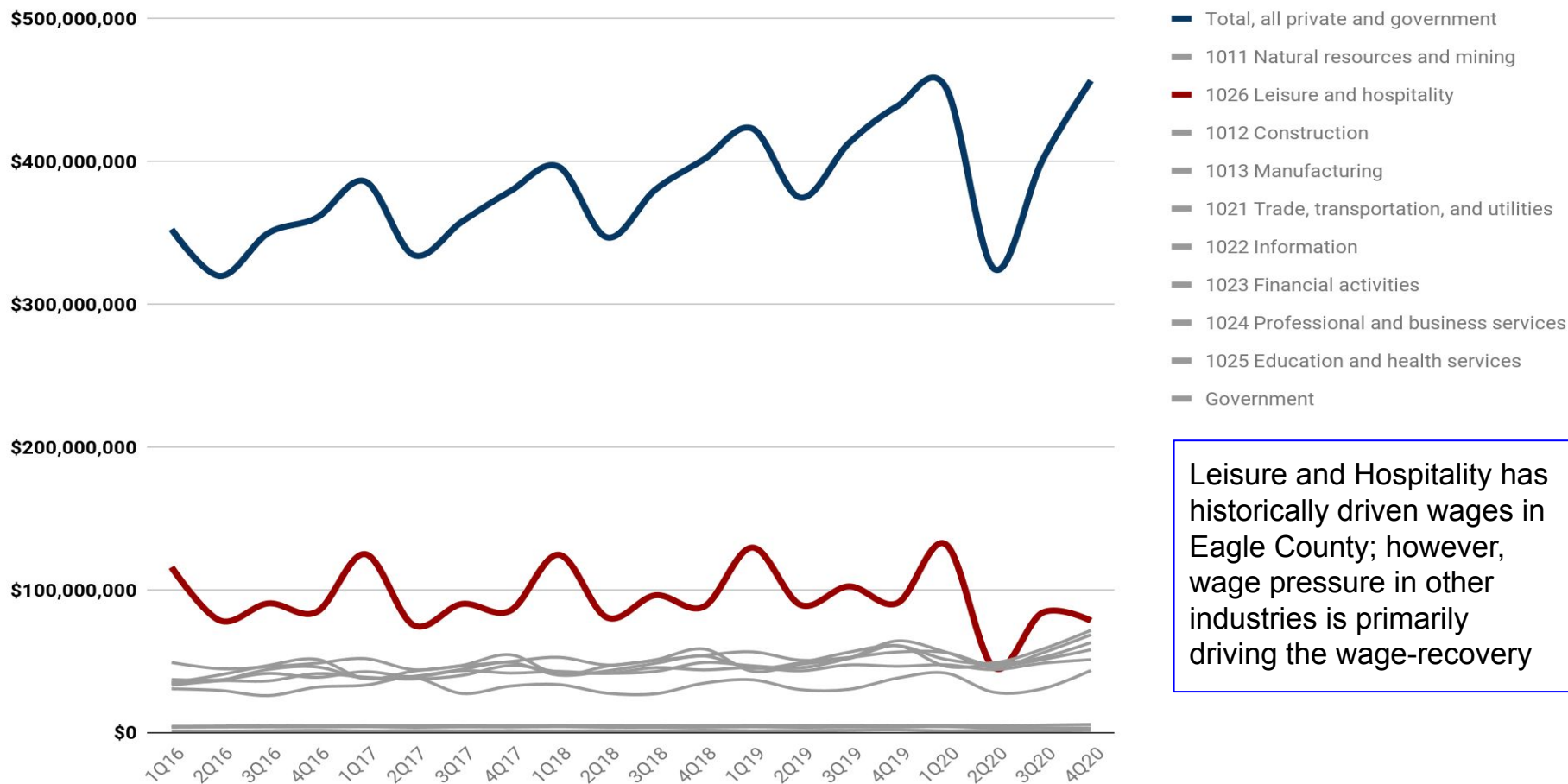
Eagle County QCEW Establishments



Eagle County QCEW Employment

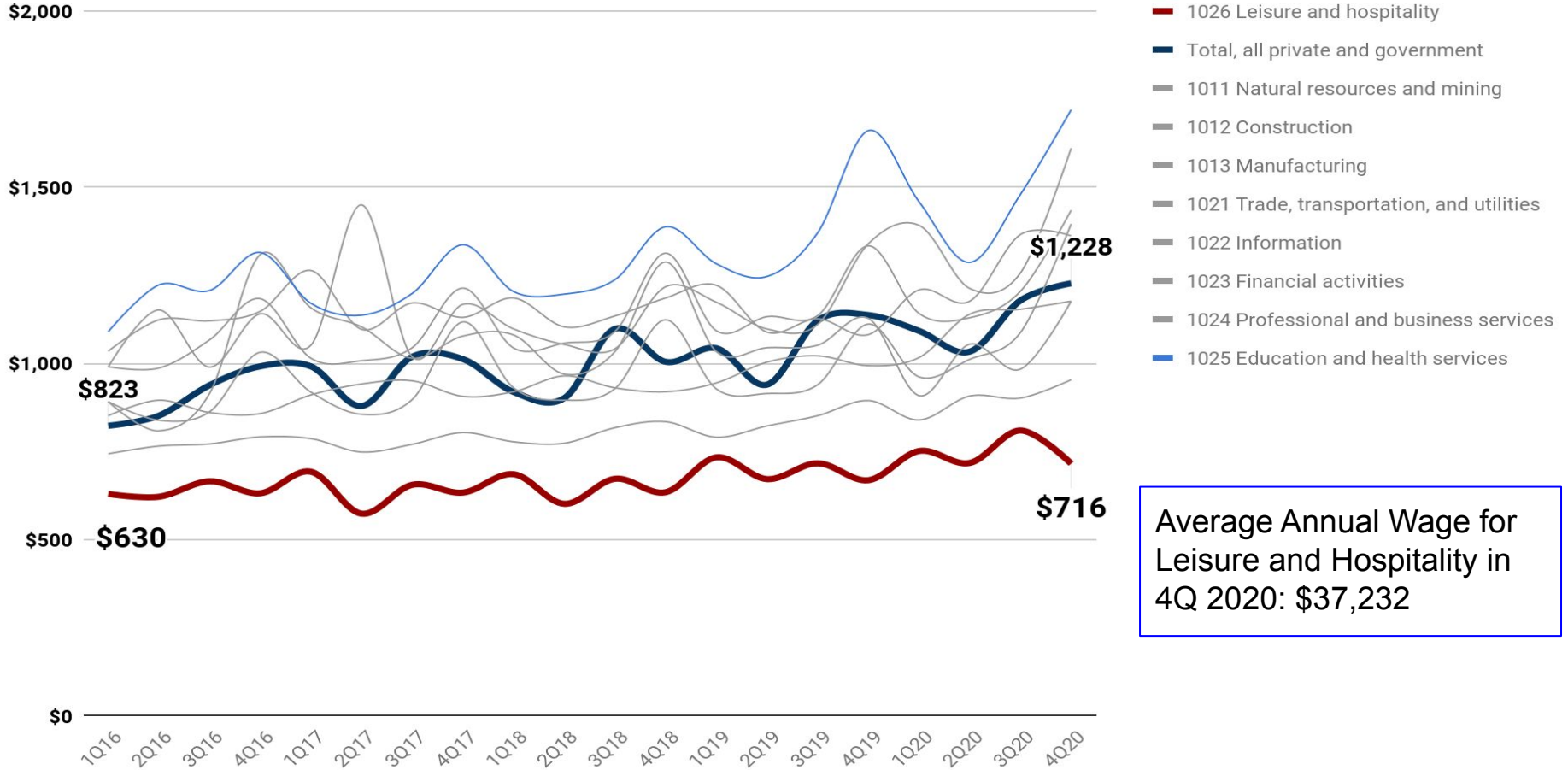


Eagle County QCEW Total Wages



Leisure and Hospitality has historically driven wages in Eagle County; however, wage pressure in other industries is primarily driving the wage-recovery

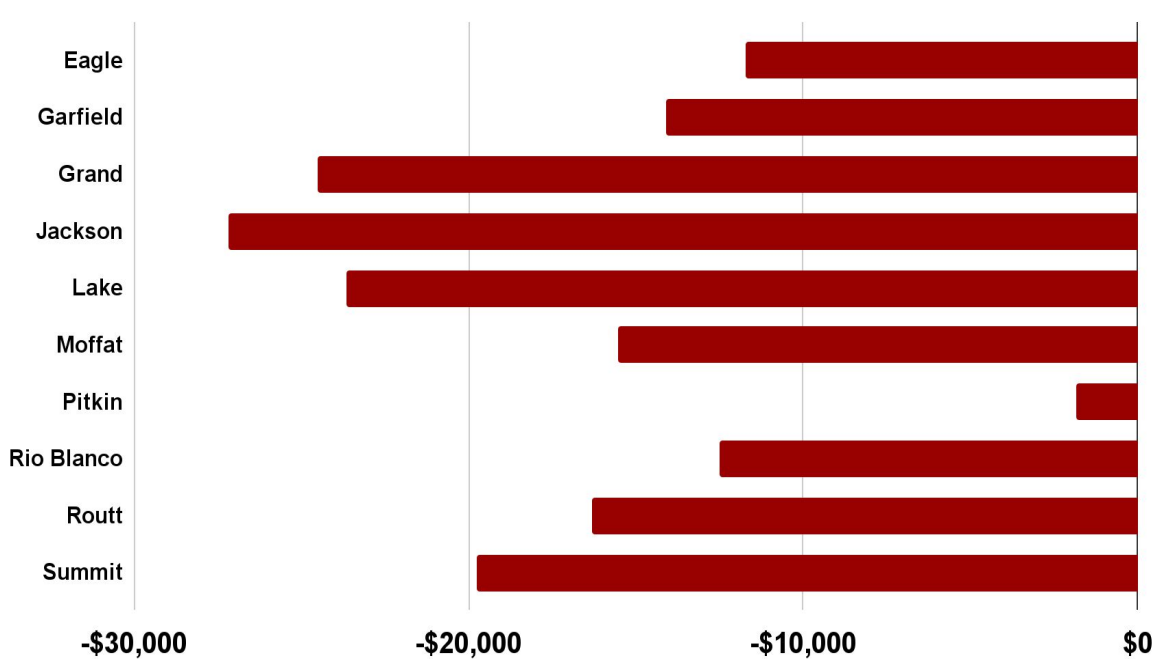
Eagle County QCEW Average Weekly Wage



Average Annual Wage for Leisure and Hospitality in 4Q 2020: \$37,232

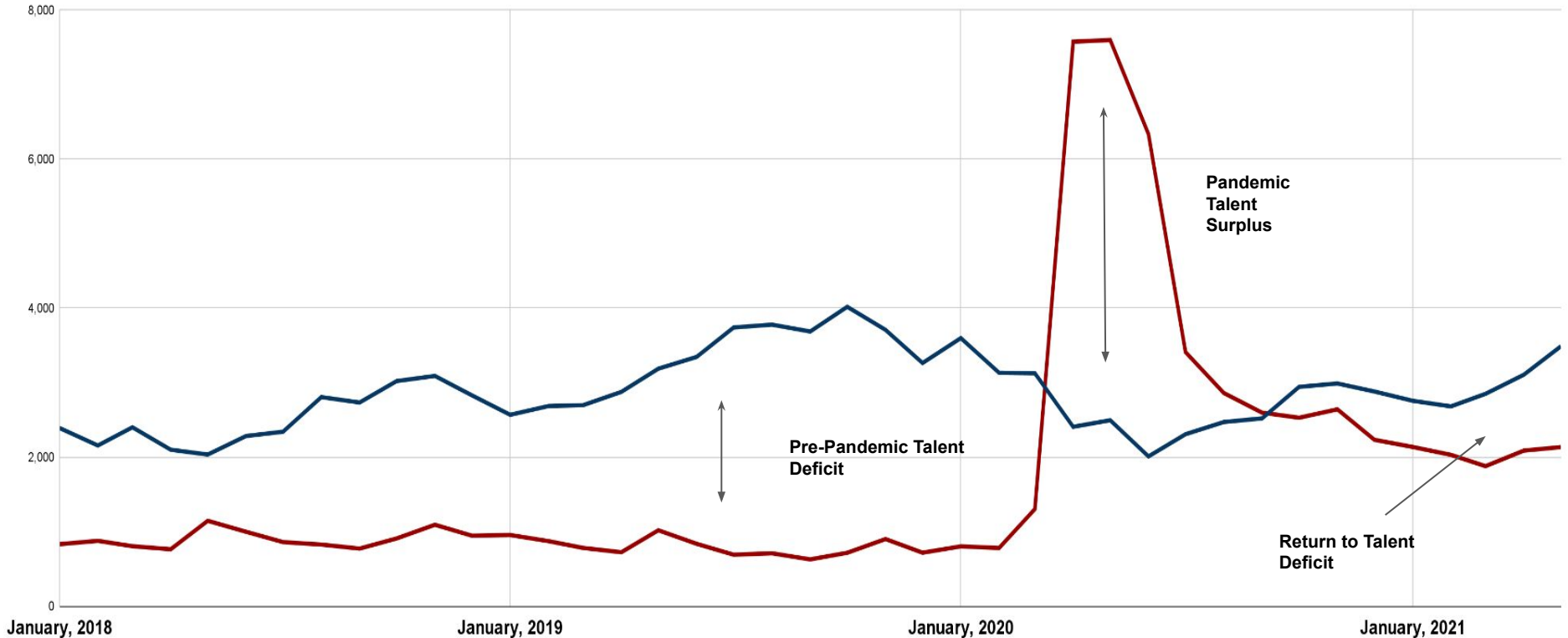

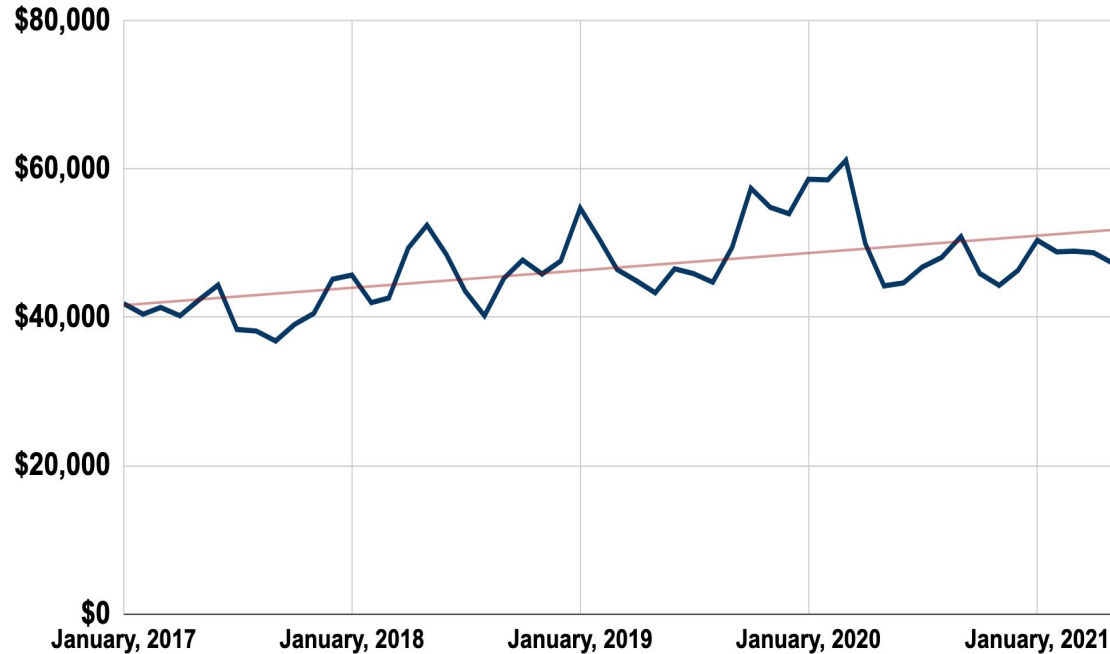

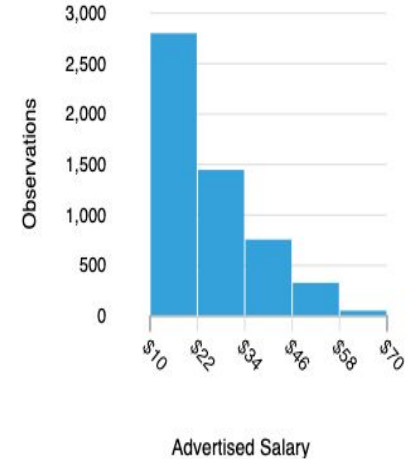
Eagle County Average Posted Wages (Job advertisements)



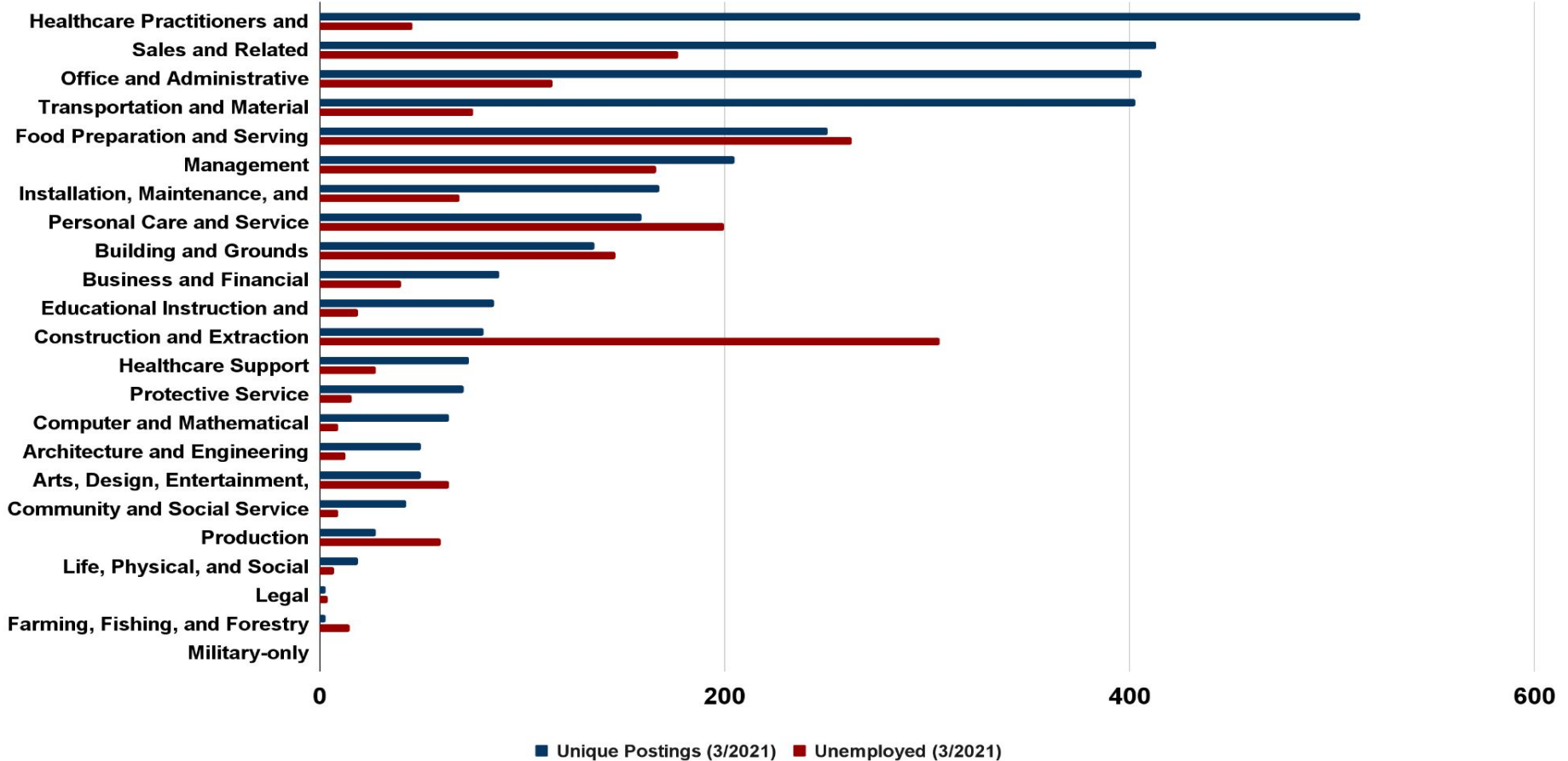

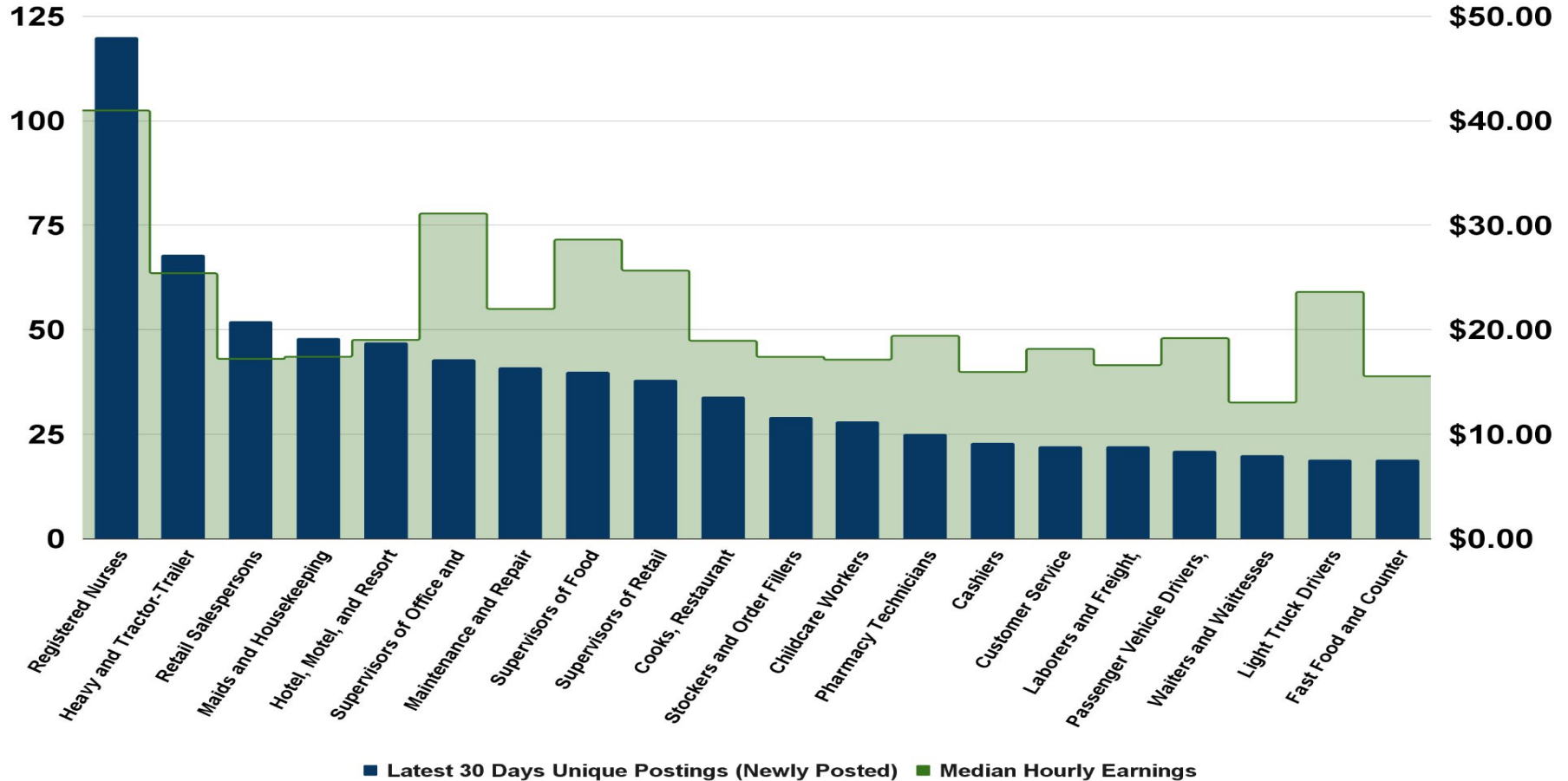

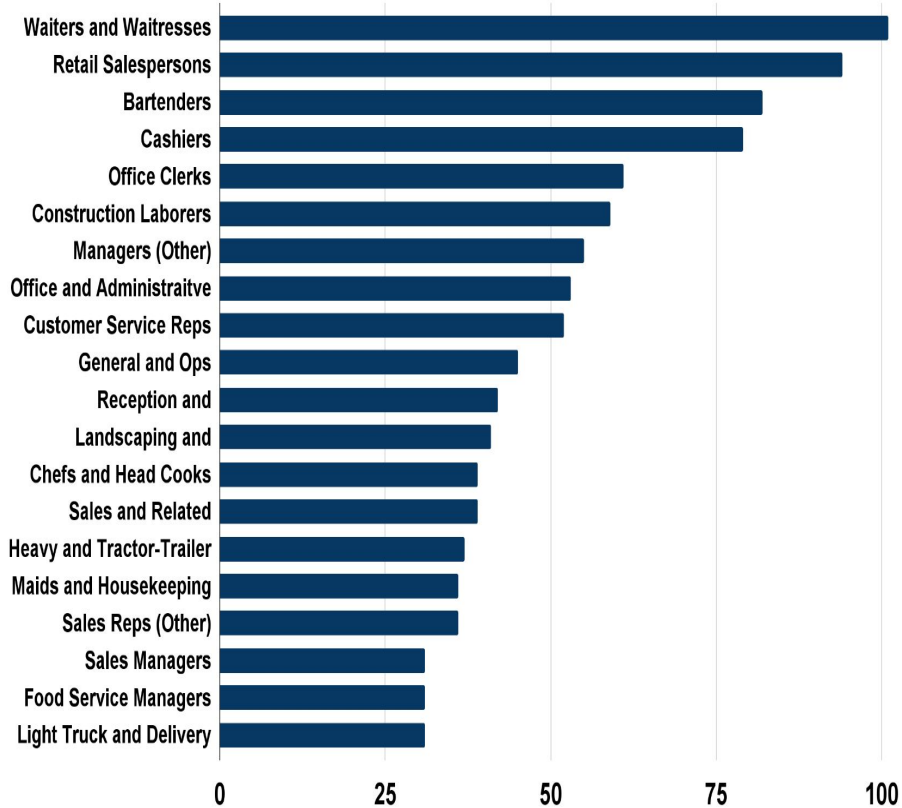

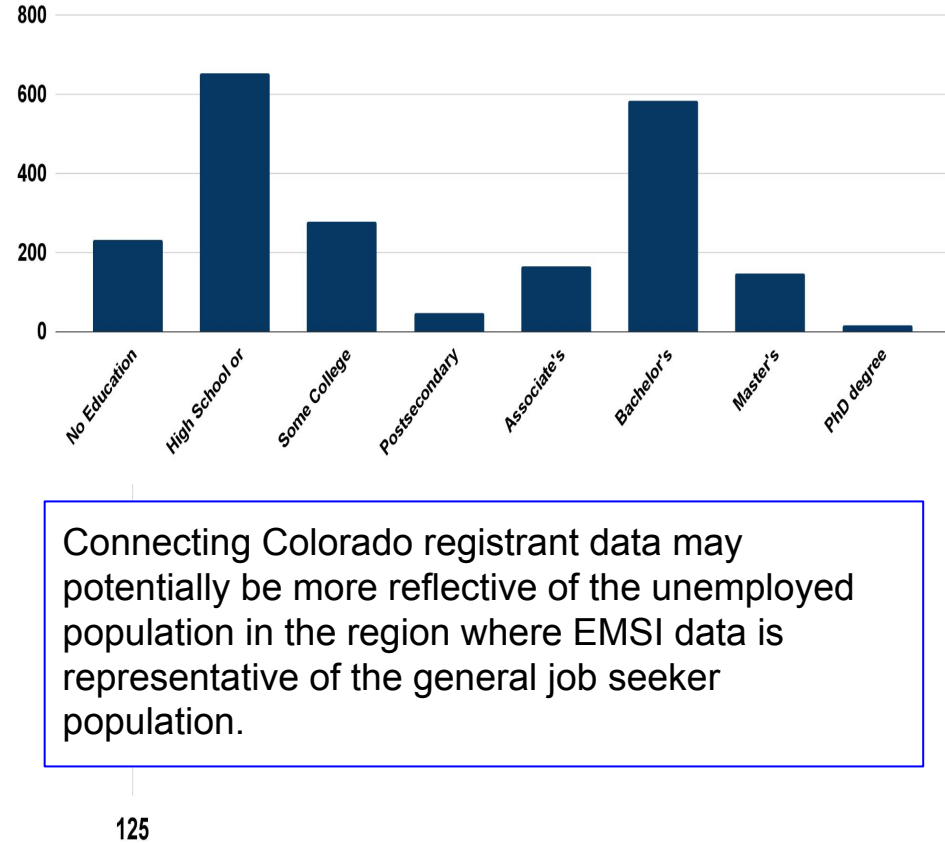
Workforce System Registrants

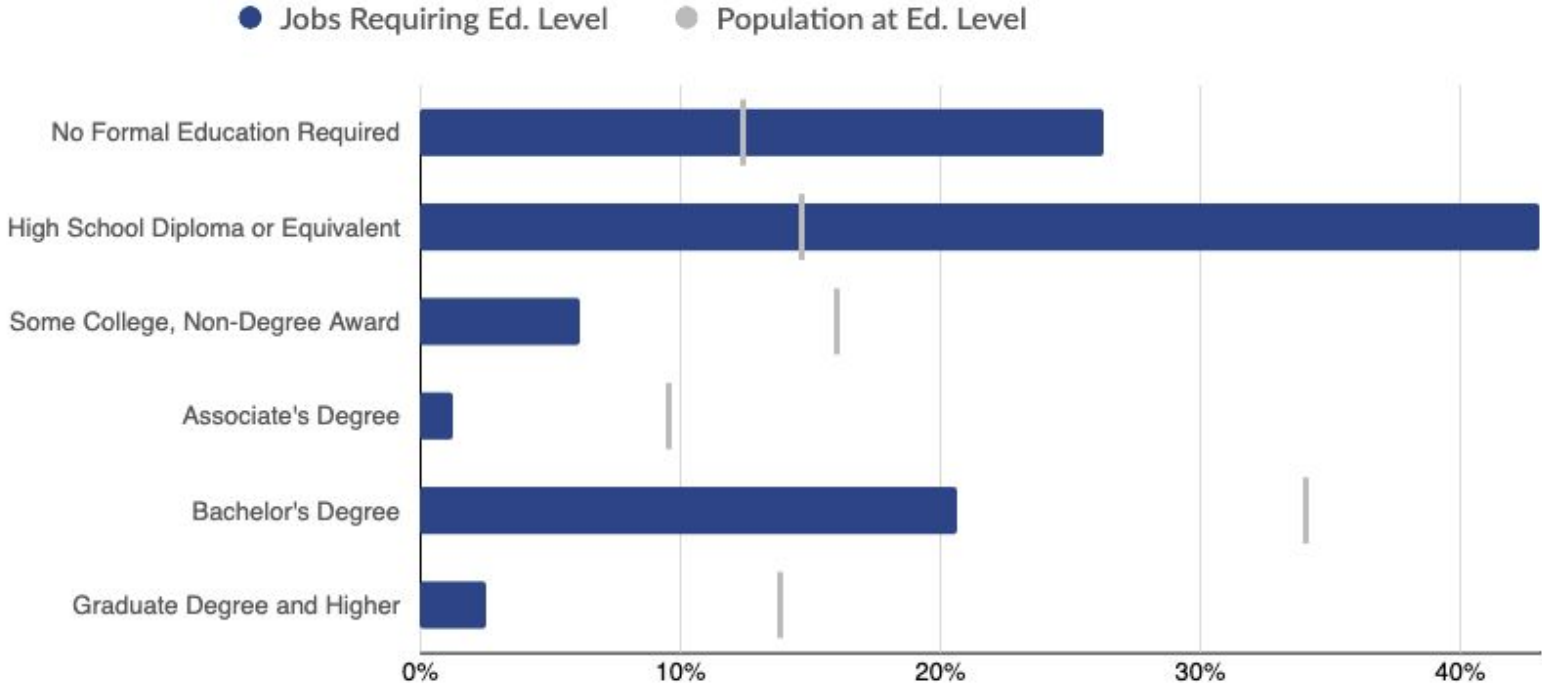


Educational Attainment- System Registrants

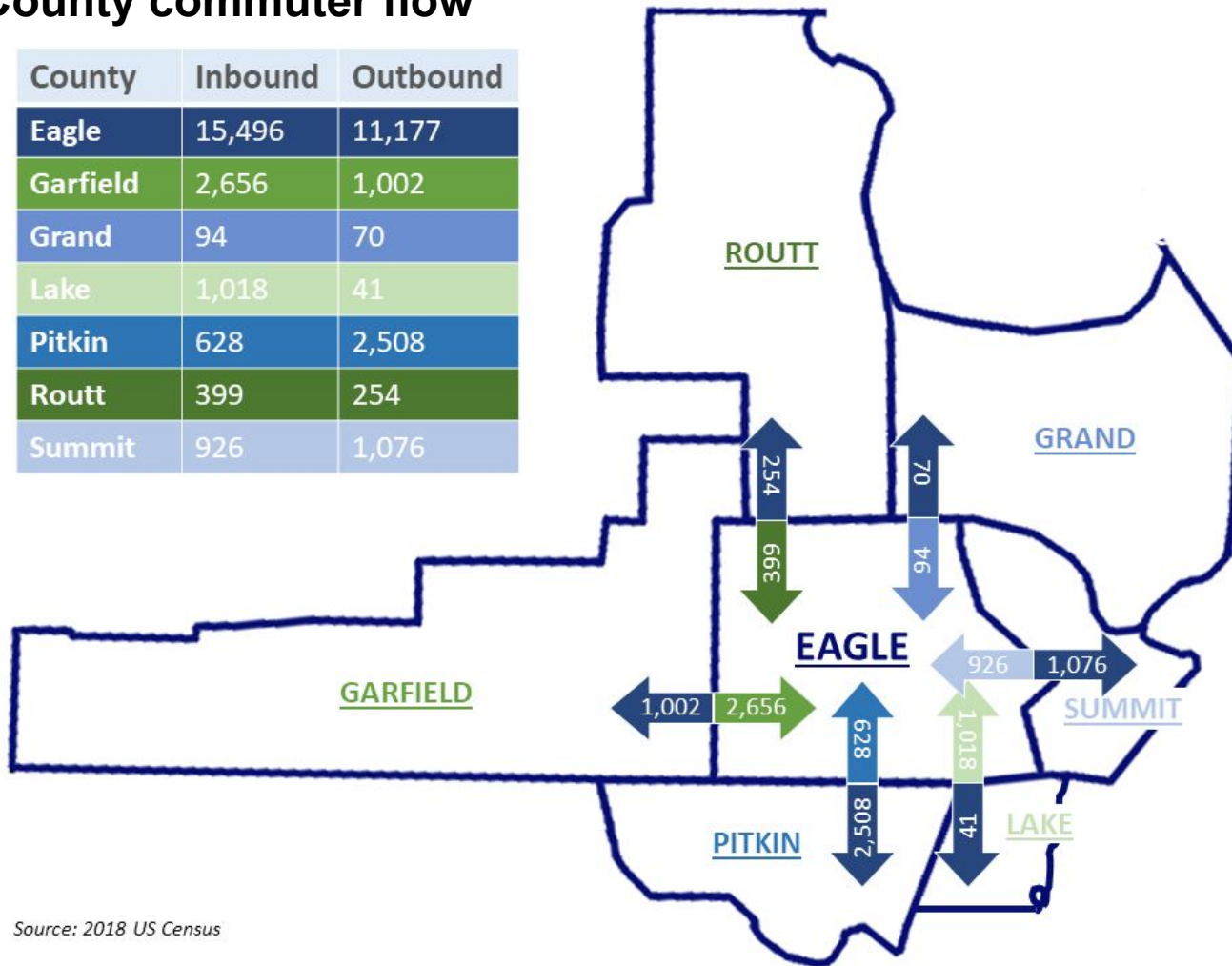

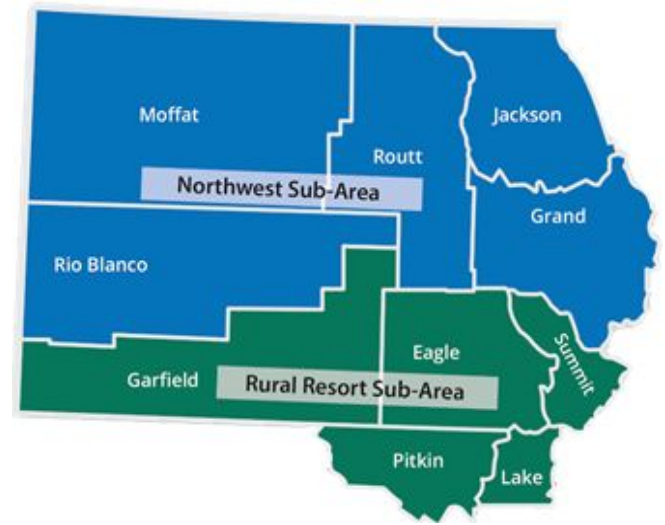
